A LEGEND SAYS THAT.....

In the Sanctuary of Santa Maria della Pace at San Michele Extra (VR), there is a stuffed Nile crocodile 5 m long. According to legend, the reptile was an ex-voto offered by a noblewoman in the 600's in exchange for her acquired good health after having approached the Madonna with faith. The crocodile, which supposedly weighed about 1,000 kg, was brought to Italy by a noblewoman's ancestor, a crusader knight. In the early 900's, the friars of the Sanctuary handed it over for restoration to Vittorio Dal Nero, the first director of the Museum of Natural History: after restoring it, he kept the skull at the Museum and returned the body to the friars.


WHO IS HE?

The Nile crocodile (Crocodylus niloticus) is a reptile living in Africa and its habitats are lakes, rivers and water basins of any type. It has also been sighted in salt water. Its average lifespan is 75-100 years. The length and the dimension of its body are strongly influenced by the availability of food: for this reason it can reach up to 6 m in length and weigh 1200 kg.

HOW DOES A CROCODILE EAT?

The crocodile can't chew, so it rips large chunks of meat from its prey and swallows them whole.

Its teeth are strong, they grow continuously and, if they break or fall out, are replaced by new ones.



Did you know?

The sex of crocodiles is determined by the incubation temperature of the eggs: under 29°C all will be females.
